A. Owen Aldridge has written several books about the eighteenth century, including biographies of Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Paine, and Jonathan Edwards. His latest book is *The Dragon and the Eagle: The Presence of China in the American Enlightenment* (Wayne State University Press, 1993).

Wayne Allen, an Adjunct Salvatori Fellow at The Heritage Foundation, formerly taught in the Political Science Department at Louisiana State University and was Assistant to the Director (Ellis Sandoz) of the Eric Voegelin Institute for American Renaissance Studies.

Milton Birnbaum is Professor of English and Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences at American International College. He has published a book on Aldous Huxley and many articles in scholarly publications.

He was the editor of the books *Film and the Liberal Arts* and *Focus on the Horror Film*. T. J. Ross died on October 3, 1994.
